

# Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord ~ March 30 and 31, 2024

Easter is the Christian Feast celebrating the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. In Christian tradition, the Resurrection represents Christ's victory over death and the promise of eternal life for His disciples. Let us remind ourselves about the famous quote from Archbishop Fulton Sheen "Unless there is a Good Friday in your life, there can be no Easter Sunday." This year's Easter echoes explicitly the significance of the Passion, Death and the Resurrection of Christ and how it resonates so well to our lives today. Regardless of what is happening in our society today, we should and must be grateful to God for his love and mercy to all of us. I am recommending that we personalize this Easter celebration. Recalling the Easter reality in the life of Christ, we can acknowledge that, by the gift of faith, we have been able to pick a winner. But the hidden reality and the source of Easter joy is the fact that a winner has chosen us! The triumph is Christ's, of course, but he has chosen to share that victory with us and make all of us winners. How can we not be happy today? How can we not be grateful?

May the Easter message of Jesus, "Peace be with you!" be the gift your families and friends celebrate with each other, the gift we celebrate with each other and the gift that together we breathe into all we meet.

# The Divine Mercy Novena


#### THE DIVINE MERCY NOVENA

# The Divine Mercy Chaplet

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross
- 2. Opening Prayer

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

Repeat three times: O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!

#### 3. Our Father

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.

### 4. Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

#### 5. The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

#### 6. The Eternal Father

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

7. On the 10 Small Beads of Each Decade

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. Repeat for the remaining decades

Saying the "Eternal Father..." (see 6. above) on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion..." (see 7. above) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

9. Conclude with

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world. (Repeat three times)

## 10. Closing Prayers

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself. Jesus, I trust in You.


