

Traditions and Treasures

Many people prepare for this feast as the apostles did before the first Pentecost: by praying a novena. The Novena to the Holy Ghost is prayed starting on the day after Ascension Thursday, and ending on the eve of the Pentecost. This novena asks God to grant you the Seven Gifts of the Holy Ghost. ...

The Dove -- the form the Holy Ghost took at Christ's Baptism -- is the primary symbol of the day. In medieval times, there even used to be "Holy Ghost Holes" in the roofs of some churches from which a dove -- real or a model -- would be lowered over the congregation as trumpets sounded or the choir mimicked the sounds of rustling winds. When the dove descended, red rose petals (or, incredibly, pieces of burning straw symbolizing the "tongues of flame" in Acts) would shower down. This loveliness still takes place today in many churches, among them the Pantheon in Rome.

Aside from the dove, there are other symbols for the day: the liturgical color red representing the Holy Ghost, the color white representing the white robes of the Catechumens, red and/or white flowers, lots of greenery to symbolize life (the color green represents hope and life and, in Eastern Churches, the Holy Ghost), fire, the number three representing the Theological Virtues given to us by the Holy Ghost, the number seven representing the Gifts of the Holy Ghost, the number 12 representing the Fruits of the Holy Ghost, etc...

On this day, as on 1 January, a plenary indulgence can be acquired, under the usual conditions, by reciting the "Veni, Creator Spiritus" (Come, Holy Spirit), a prayer attributed to Rabanus Maurus (A.D. 776-856). It is prayed during the liturgy today.

As Cardinal Elio Sgreccia, former President of the Vatican's Pontifical Academy for Life has said, "The Church must speak out in today's context on fundamental rights, the right to justice, the right to peace, but above all and in the first place, the right to life. If the Church did not speak, did not proclaim the truth, it would be abandoning its duty; it would be unfaithful to society, to the good of society. Therefore, its precise duty is the very liberty to intervene with word, and also with example -- the example of promoting human life, of intervening for the salvation of mankind." ~ priestsforlife.org

Fatima Statue Visit



The World Apostolate of Fatima, USA/Our Lady's Blue Army is launching a tour of the historic National Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Fatima ahead of the Eucharistic Revival walking pilgrimage along the Seton route, from Connecticut to Indianapolis.

The Cleveland Division of the World Apostolate of Fatima is bringing Her to the Cleveland Diocese, to ten host parishes for a Night of Love, offering an evening vigil of Eucharistic reparation for the return of fallen-away and marginal Catholics.

Petitions for these conversions are being gathered from across the diocese to be carried in Our Lady's Heart to the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis.



COAR Mission Appeal

Next Sunday, Nicolette Cregan will be speaking at the Masses regarding COAR Mission Appeal - Community Oscar Arnulfo Romero, COAR is located in Zaragoza, El Salvador. It was founded in 1980 by a Cleveland Diocese Mission Team priest Fr. Ken Myers during El Salvador's brutal civil war. Fr. Ken and fellow Cleveland Mission Team members Sr. Dorothy Kazel, OSU, and Jean Donovan (murdered December 2, 1980) began gathering orphans from refugee camps and bringing them back to the Mission's parish of Zaragoza. COAR is a foster care facility, school, clinic servicing vulnerable children in El Salvador.

- Visit a special place to remember or plant a flower in honor of vour parent.


