

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross — September 13 and 14, 2025

REFLECTION

The transforming power of the Cross is a point of our reflection this Sunday. The Israelites were healed from the saraph serpents' bites when they looked at the bronze serpent mounted on the cross. A serpent, in reality, signifies the bitter and deadly sin which "bites" the human soul. God in His Love sent Jesus in the likeness of sinful flesh to destroy the power of sin by His Holy Death on the Cross. Jesus told Nicodemus and to us all, "...so must the Son of Man be lifted up: so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish; but may have life everlasting." The Cross stores and restores the riches of our Salvation. The Celebration of the Cross is a good reminder to us to humble ourselves like Jesus to accept sacrifices for the benefit of our brothers and sisters. Know that the Father who exalted Jesus on the Cross will abundantly reward you, especially, when you are on the cross with Jesus.

Collection for Victims of Gaza

This weekend, September 13th and 14th, there will be a second collection for Victims in Gaza

Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio, President of the USCCB, has written to all the bishops of the USA asking them to take up a special collection to assist the Christians and other innocent victims of violence in Gaza and surrounding areas who are struggling to survive, protect their children and live with dignity in dire conditions.

The Holy Father continues to call for a cease fire and for aid to enter the territory, noting with great sorrow that "Gaza is starving".

Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA) and Catholic Relief Services (CRS) both are providing vital emergency humanitarian relief and medical and psychological care for the sick, malnourished and wounded. The situation in Gaza and across the Middle East cries out for the assistance of the Catholic community of the United States.

Treasures from our Tradition

Exaltation of the Holy Cross

This day is also called the Triumph of the Cross, Elevation of the Cross, Holy Cross Day, Holy Rood Day, or Roodmas. The liturgy of the Cross is a triumphant liturgy. When Moses lifted up the bronze serpent over the people, it was a foreshadowing of the salvation through Jesus when He was lifted up on the Cross. ... — <https://www.catholicculture.org/culture/liturgicalyear/calendar/day.cfm?date=2025-09-14>

The feast celebrates a double anniversary. In Jerusalem, Constantine erected a round church, Anastasias, above the empty grave of Jesus, and a basilica, the Martyrium; in the square between the two churches, a shrine, Calvarium, marking the place of the crucifixion. Dedicated in 335, they were destroyed by the Persians in 614. The two churches were rebuilt by Patriarch Modestus of Jerusalem c. 626 but were later destroyed by the Muslims in 1009. The present church of the Holy Sepulcher, rebuilt by the Crusaders, was dedicated in 1149. Today also commemorates the discovery of the Lord's cross by the empress, St. Helena in 320.

Formerly, the Wednesday, Friday and Saturday following the feast of the Holy Cross were observed as Ember Days, a time to give thanks to God for the first fruits of the harvest.

Pro-Life

Pope Leo XIV has issued a clarion call to Catholic politicians worldwide, urging them to align their actions with the Church's teachings on the sanctity of life. This new message follows on the heels of a recent pro-life message where the Pope emphasized the need to reject "voices of death" and embrace a culture of life.

Pope Leo firmly rejected the false notion of Catholic politicians saying they are "personally pro-life" but voting for abortion: "There is no division within the personality of a public figure: there is not on one side the politician, and on the other the Christian." "Rather, there is the politician who, under the gaze of God and of his conscience, lives out his commitments and his responsibilities in a Christian manner," he said.

...Addressing a global audience, Pope Leo XIV called on Catholic politicians to reflect the Church's teachings in their legislative decisions, particularly on issues like abortion, euthanasia, and the treatment of the vulnerable. This message indirectly challenges Catholic politicians to uphold the sacredness of life in their public roles, aligning their policies with the Church's moral framework. — <https://www.lifenews.com/2025/08/28/pope-leo-tells-catholic-politicians-you-cant-be-catholic-and-pro-abortion/>

Parish Ministries

Our Parish Ministries are in need of your financial support... The St. Stephen Outreach and St. Vincent DePaul Ministries are supported only by the direct donations of our generous donors. No Offertory, EN, Christmas Appeal or other special campaign donation monies are used to support these critical ministries. Non-parish benefactors such as St. Bernadette's Church and their Knights of Columbus chapter, as well as Mr. Mark Stepowoy who provides monies for Thanksgiving turkeys each year, have kept these ministries afloat. However, the cost of groceries for our monthly Food Pantry has gone up substantially this year, as has the number of those within our community who are in need. In addition to operating the Food Pantry, our Outreach Ministry provides quarterly meals to the House of Champions (a local after-school program that supports inner-city youth living in poverty), conducts our Adopt-a-Family program at Christmas in association with St. Bernadette's parish, and supplements (where possible) the work of our St. Vincent DePaul Ministry in their support of those in desperate need of assistance with rent, utilities, clothing, vehicle repairs, etc.

There are only 5 Food Pantry and 5 SVDP Ministry appeal envelopes issued a year, but we can accept donations to these ministries at any time during the year. Just indicate on your check or any church envelope that you wish this donation to be applied to our Outreach or SVDP ministries only. Thank you for supporting these critical ministries and the much needed services they provide for our St. Stephen Parish community!



Around the Diocese

Our Lady of Sorrows — September 15

This feast dates back to the 12th century.... In 1482, the feast was added to the Missal under the title of "Our Lady of Compassion." Pope Benedict XIII added it to the Roman Calendar in 1727 on the Friday before Palm Sunday. In 1913, Pope Pius X fixed the date on September 15. The title "Our Lady of Sorrows" focuses on Mary's intense suffering during the passion and death of Christ. "The Seven Dolors," the title by which it was celebrated in the 17th century, referred to the seven swords that pierced the Heart of Mary. The feast is like an octave for the birthday of Our Lady on September 8th. —Excerpted from Our Lady of Sorrows by Fr. Paul Haffner (Inside the Vatican, September 2004)



This feast is dedicated to the spiritual martyrdom of Mary, Mother of God, and her compassion with the sufferings of her Divine Son, Jesus. In her suffering as co-redemeer, she reminds us of the tremendous evil of sin and shows us the way of true repentance. May the numerous tears of the Mother of God be conducive to our salvation; with which tears Thou, O God, art able to wash away the sins of the whole world.

As Mary stood at the foot of the Cross on which Jesus hung, the sword of sorrow Simeon had foretold pierced her soul. Below are the seven sorrows of Mary:

1. The prophecy of Simeon, (Luke 2:25-35)
2. The flight into Egypt, (Matthew 2:13-15)
3. Loss of the Child Jesus for three days, (Luke 2:41-50)
4. Mary meets Jesus on his way to Calvary, (Luke 23:27-31; John 19:17)
5. Crucifixion and Death of Jesus, (John 19:25-30)
6. The body of Jesus being taken from the Cross (deposition from the Cross), (Psalm 130; Luke 23:50-54; John 19:31-37)
7. The burial of Jesus, (Isaiah 53:8; Luke 23:50-56; John 19:38-42; Mark 15:40-47)

PROMISES OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS

These are the promises Our Lady made, through St. Bridget of Sweden, to those who are devoted to meditating on her Seven Sorrows:

1. "I will grant peace to their families."
2. "They will be enlightened about the Divine Mysteries."
3. "I will console them in their pains and I will accompany them in their work."
4. "I will give them as much as they ask for as long as it does not oppose the adorable will of my Divine Son or the sanctification of their souls."
5. "I will defend them in their spiritual battles with the infernal enemy and I will protect them at every instant of their lives."
6. "I will visibly help them at the moment of their death. They will see the face of their Mother."
7. "I have obtained this grace from my divine Son, that those who propagate this devotion to my tears and dolors, will be taken directly from this earthly life to eternal happiness since all their sins will be forgiven and my Son and I will be their eternal consolation and joy."
