REFLECTION

St. Paul stands out as an outstanding figure who was converted from being the master of his own life and the lives of others to a humble servant of God and humanity. He came to the realization that he owed his existence to God, and as such he does not belong to himself. With this realization, he offers his life and service as a sacrifice to God to whom he completely surrenders. The Pharisee in the Gospel represents St. Paul's attitude before conversion. He is the self-proclaimer master, "I am not like the tax collectors and other sinners." He counts himself worthy and labels the others as unworthy. The tax collector, on the contrary, represents converted Paul who owns up his limitations and ready to turn to God, whom he acknowledges as the Master, to guide him through. He thus becomes God's servant, a disciple and apostle who will stop at nothing to ensure that the mission of God is done. He does not care what it will cost him, for, to him, nothing counts more than the crown God has assured his servant. Today we can judge ourselves. Are we the Pharisee or the tax collector? Are we Saul or Paul?

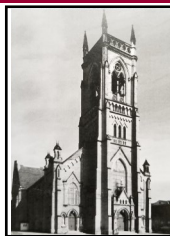

Treasures of our Traditions

In the Extraordinary Rite calendar, the last Sunday in October celebrates the **Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King**. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI at the close of the Holy Year, 1925. The purpose of the Holy Father was to bring home to all mankind the fact that Christ is King not merely over individuals, but over families and societies, over states and nations, over rulers and tribunals as well. The duty of Catholics is to hasten the return of the world to His authority by their prayers, their influence and their actions. They are reminded that they must courageously fight under His royal banner, with the weapons of the spirit, for the rights of God and of His Church. The last Sunday of October was chosen for the feast, the Sunday preceding All Saints, because during this month the liturgical year draws to its close and thus the mysteries of Jesus Christ are fittingly completed and crowned by the liturgical festival of Christ, the King. On the same day also will annually take place the consecration of mankind to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.*

In 1969, Pope Paul VI took several steps to enhance the witness of the feast day. To emphasize Christ's universal reign, he changed the name of the celebration to the feast of "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of All" (*Domini Nostri Iesu Christi universorum Regis*). He also changed the date to the last Sunday in the liturgical year, emphasizing even more strongly the connection between Christ's kingship and His second advent (coming) to judge the world. In addition, the pope raised the feast to the highest rank of celebration on the Church calendar, that of a "solemnity." — Pope Pius XI, encyclical *Quas Primas*, no. 24

Nov. 1. The Feast of All Saints: The custom of keeping holy one day in the year as the festival of all God's saints, whether commemorated in the Liturgy or not, dates back to at least the beginning of the Fifth Century. In ancient times, it was usually called the feast of All Holy Martyrs. The day of its celebration varied; and in the East, even now, All Saints is in most places a movable feast. Pope St. Boniface IV, when dedicating the Roman Pantheon as the Church of Our Blessed Lady and All Holy Martyrs, appointed November 1 for the chief annual festival in the sacred building. Gregory III built an oratory at St. Peter's in honor of all the saints, confessors as well as martyrs, who had died in all parts of the world. Gregory IV chose November 1 as the Feast of All Saints. The Octave was added by Sixtus IV. The New Roman Missal, Fr. F.X. Lasance

All Saints' Day / All Souls' Day

ALL SAINTS' DAY—November 1st

The Solemnity of All Saints is not a holy day of obligation this year. Therefore, Mass on Friday evening, October 31, is of the day, not the vigil of All Saints. **The Solemnity of All Saints will be celebrated on Saturday, November 1st at 9:30am.** The 5:00pm Mass on All Saints' Day will be celebrated for The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed.

ALL SOULS' DAY—November 2nd

All Souls' Day, also called The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, is a day of prayer and remembrance for the faithful departed. **Please write the names of your deceased loved ones on your All Souls' Day envelope and place it into the collection basket. These names will be placed on the altar and remembered during all the Masses in November.**

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed:

The memento of the dead ... is common to all Liturgies since the 3rd century. In the 8th century we find among the customs of the monastery of Fulda that of celebrating each month a commemoration of the faithful departed with a special Office and special prayers. ... towards the 10 Century, ... the custom prevailed of commemorating every year the benefactors and friends of the house who had been taken from this world. St. Odilo, Abbot of Cluny, is generally recognized as having been responsible for the universal adoption of this custom, already in use in many churches. -The New Roman Missal, Fr. F.X. Lasance

Plenary Indulgence for the Poor Souls

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls. From **November 2 — November 9** inclusive, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray for the departed.

Six general rules for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence:

- State of grace at least when performing the indulgenced act
- Complete detachment from sin, even venial sin
- Confession (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)
- Communion (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)
- Prayers for the Supreme Pontiff (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)
- Indulgenced act: a special good work with special conditions of place and time

Indulgenced acts to be performed for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence for the Poor Souls of Purgatory:

From **November 2 to November 9**: visit a cemetery with mental prayer for the poor souls.

On **November 2**: visit a church or an oratory with one Our Father and one Creed being recited.

On these days, a partial indulgence can be obtained any time by visiting a cemetery and praying for the Poor Souls.

The following prayer is especially recommended:

Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

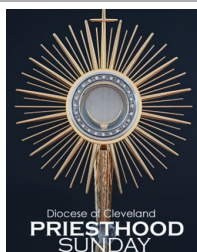
