

# The Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time — November 15 & 16, 2025

#### REFLECTION

Jesus is not a tourist, marveling at the external beauty of the temple building! He is a prophet who looks beyond appearance and sees the unworthiness of the temple worship that no longer brings people closer to God, worship that has become fruitless as far as the kingdom of God is concerned. A temple that does not fulfil its purpose will be destroyed. These events will take place some forty years later when the Roman army will invade Israel to silence a rebellion against Rome's colonial rule. However, before this happens, the faith of the disciples will be put on trial. They will experience persecution for their belief in Jesus. Jesus, however, tells them to take these difficulties as opportunities. Standing trial, they will have an audience to whom they can give testimony to their faith. This is the Christian approach to life: to look at difficulties as opportunities. Every challenge can become an occasion to do good. In the midst of trouble, we are not to get discouraged but to ask God to show us how to use our plights for the benefit of those around us. If we really believe we are in the hands of God, no evil can touch us; even if we lose our earthly life, we will live with God forever in His kingdom. ~ Fr. Caroli Shao, A.J.

#### Traditions and Treasures

#### THE PRESENTATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY—NOVEMBER 21

Just as we celebrate the birth of Jesus, the feast of His Holy Name and His presentation in the Temple, so too the Church solemnizes the nativity of the Blessed Virgin, the feast of her holy name and her presentation-in the Temple. The tradition that Mary when three years old was presented by her parents in the Temple in order to be brought up in the shadow of the tabernacle is first found in the apocryphal Gospels. It agrees, however, so completely with the sentiment of Catholic devotion concerning that part of the immaculate life of Mary not mentioned in the Gospel, that it found favor with Catholics too. It was celebrated in the East as early as the Sixth Century. It was introduced in the West by the agency of Philippe de Maizieres, envoy of the King of Cyprus to the papal Court of Avignon. He described the festival as celebrated in the East in such glowing colors that Gregory XI introduced it into the Calendar of the Curia.

Mary was brought by her parents to the Temple at Jerusalem in order that the Rod of Jesse from whence the Flower of Nazareth would blossom should be preserved from all danger in the shadow of the sanctuary. — The New Roman Missal, Rev. F.X. Lasance





#### Diocesan Sacred Heart Enthronement Holy Hour


