

## Second Sunday of Lent — February 28 and March 1, 2026

### REFLECTION

The Gospel of the Second Sunday of Lent presents the Divinity of Jesus in His Glorious Transfiguration. In the presence of the three Apostles and the prophets, a voice from the cloud said, "This is My Beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him." In the first reading, Abram also heard a voice which said, "Go from the land of your kinsfolk and from the Father's house to a new land that I will show you." Abram obeyed the voice of the Lord and his obedience and faith became a model for us. To share in the glorious life of Jesus, we are called to listen to Him. The way of Jesus among other things includes sacrifice for others, rejection, persecution, forgiveness, care for the marginalized, death, and Resurrection. The Transfiguration of the Lord is a source of encouragement for us that the road to Salvation involves challenges and hardships. The Season of Lent is an opportune moment for us to listen to the voice of Christ in the cries of the hungry, the sick, the lonely, strangers, homeless, etc. The same voice of Christ in this season is directed to us to return to the Merciful Father through His Beloved Son, Jesus Christ.

### Treasures and Traditions

The Second Sunday of Lent every year recalls the Transfiguration of the Lord. Since the fourth century, Mount Tabor has been the focus of devotion to this event. As mountains go, it is not particularly lofty, rising about fifteen hundred feet, within view of the Sea of Galilee and very close to Nazareth. Scripture doesn't identify the mountain, but in the year 348 Saint Cyril of Jerusalem said he preferred Mount Tabor to Mount Hermon as the site of the Transfiguration, and his opinion won. It has long been a strategic military site, and ancient fortresses are visible on the heights. Over the centuries, churches and fortified monasteries rose on the mountaintop, only to be destroyed by various invaders. Six hundred years ago, local Christians started to decorate the ruins with flags and banners on the Feast of the Transfiguration. In 1631, the Sultan granted permission to the Franciscans to live on Mount Tabor, and they have been there ever since, discovering the ruins of an old Crusader church and constructing the present church on the site in 1924.

The top of the mountain is divided into Greek Orthodox and Latin zones. At one time, tourists arrived on the summit by bus, but this is no longer permitted. Some ride bicycles up a challenging and winding path, while others take the four thousand three hundred steps constructed for Christian pilgrims in the fourth century. It's hard to imagine the fishermen following Jesus up this craggy mountain without complaint. Visitors will sympathize with Peter's plan to construct booths and stay put with Jesus, Moses, and Elijah for a while, enjoying the view, and planning the trip back down.—Rev. James Field

### Pro-Life



The Catholic Conference of Ohio testified in support of House Bill 347 (R-Odioso | R-Williams) to enact the Share the Health and Empower With Informed Notices (SHE WINS) Act regarding abortion informed consent. "Community-based efforts such as Walking with Moms in Need connect women with resources and assistance, helping them to simultaneously welcome their children and achieve their goals," testified CCO. The testimony continued, "HB 347 ensures women are informed of alternatives, the availability of medical assistance benefits that may be available for prenatal, birth, and postpartum care, and ensures that she is fully informed about the nature of the procedure, any associated risks, and receives information on the status of any risks associated with her pregnancy. .... #### 2026 DIOCESAN-WIDE EVENING OF CONFESSION

The 2026 diocesan-wide Evening of Confession will take place on Wednesday, **March 4, 2026** from 5-8 p.m.

#### GUIDE ON FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

##### Abstinence:

Begins on one's 14th birthday.  
Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent.  
Abstain from meat.

##### Days of Fast:

Applies to everyone aged 18 to 59, inclusive.  
Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.  
One full meal permitted and two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal.  
If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of our Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and celebrate more readily His Resurrection.  
Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.

#### CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES (CRS) RICE BOWL

Each Lent, Catholic families across the country unite to put their faith into action through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Through CRS Rice Bowl, families learn about how our sisters and brothers across the globe overcome hardships like hunger and malnutrition. CRS Rice Bowl is one way Catholics can enhance their Lenten fasting practice by giving up meals and donating the cost of those meals to Catholic Relief Services in order to help those who do not have enough to eat.
